## PSALM OF A YELLOW-FOOTED ROCK WALLABY

Sevenhill Retreat September 1999

After a visit to Arkaroola Sanctuary,  
Flinders Ranges. SA.

I pause as I leap upward onto a narrow rocky crag  
to sing your praise Ageless Creator God.

A yellow-footed rock wallaby, my species a vulnerable one.  
This sanctuary my home with its mountains, ridges and valleys.  
rock strata thrust upward out of the earth millions of years ago  
and glacial deposits and creek beds lined with stately river red  
gums.

Fewer goats here now to compete with me for food  
their threat to my existence slowly being reversed.

Kangaroos, emus, euros graze below  
while around us are the shrieks, whistles, cries, chirps and  
twitters of the abundant bird life.  
Elsewhere an eagle stands over its prey, defying competition.

Provident God, send good rains, almost forgotten here.  
Nourish all life and prompt my instinct to breed.  
The river gums hold high in their branches log jams carried by  
floods long past.  
Thank you for the waterholes; fill these valleys with rushing creeks  
again  
And the eremophilas and desert rose will continue to flower.  
While below me an isolated quandong still fruits and drops its  
seeds.

I hear the sound of a 4 wheel-drive in the distance.  
To see me or one of my colony is still a rare sight  
These tourists watch me with subdued excitement and note the  
sighting,  
and there is respect and awe in their regard.

Let those who come here today learn from the Aboriginal hill  
people  
whose special relationship with the land was reflected  
in their gentle and harmonious use of its resources.  
They walked this way to the Ochre Wall collecting precious trade  
for tribes far distant.

May their spirit return and bring good balance to all of Your  
creation.
